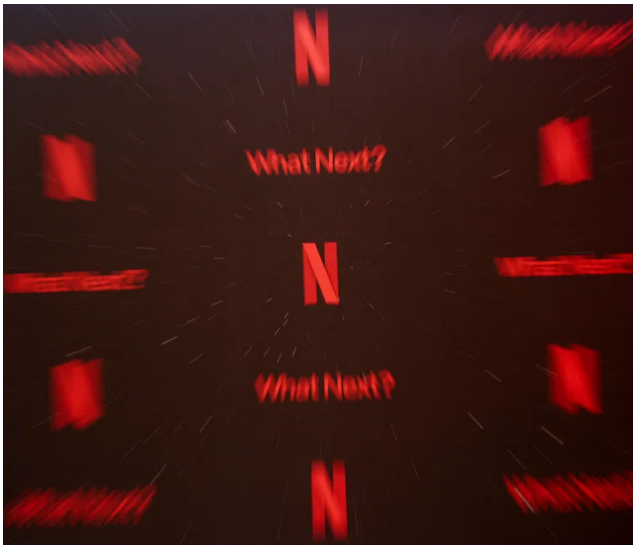


US GOV REVIEW ON NETFLIX / UNIVERSITIES VISIT TO SKIS



U.S. Probes Netflix's Growing Power in Film Industry_선주원

The Netflix is facing a major investigation by the U.S. Department of Justice over its proposed US\$72 billion takeover of Warner Bros. Discovery. Regulators are examining whether the deal could reduce competition in the entertainment industry and give Netflix too much power over filmmakers and independent studios. The investigation specifically looks at whether Netflix could use its influence to gain unfair advantages when negotiating for content and programming.

The Justice Department is also reviewing whether the merger could violate antitrust laws such as the Clayton Act and Sherman Act, which are designed to prevent monopolies and protect fair competition. The wide scope of the investigation suggests it may take several months before officials decide whether to challenge the deal in court. This delay could benefit rival bidders, including Paramount Skydance, which is also interested in acquiring Warner Bros. Discovery.

Netflix has denied claims that it holds monopoly power, stating that it operates in a highly competitive market and will cooperate with regulators. Currently, Netflix spends around US\$20 billion annually on programming and is one of the largest buyers of film and television content worldwide. If the deal proceeds, Netflix would gain control of one of the largest studios while also removing a major competitor in the streaming industry. Regulators are continuing to evaluate whether the merger could significantly reshape the global film and streaming market.
