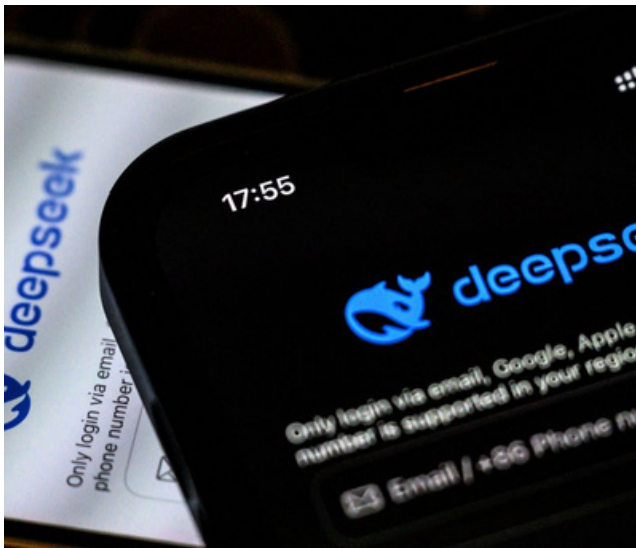

New Forecast Warns Traffic Could Plunge By 40% as AI Shakes the News Industry_선주원

As Artificial Intelligence continues to develop, it is rapidly transforming the media industry. The Firts Meeting Held for The Lowerness of Criminal Responsive Juveniles_김도영

South Korea successfully held its first meeting to discuss lowering the age of criminal responsibility for juveniles, marking the initial step in addressing the rapidly rising youth crime rate and increasingly severe criminal acts.

The Ministry of Gender Equality and Family, which led and conducted the meeting, emphasized the need for utmost caution, as this issue lies at the intersection of youth values and the threshold of criminality. It also announced plans to move beyond traditional, theoretical discussions by establishing a citizen participation panel where members can actively engage.

Furthermore, it expressed its ambition to refine the bill lowering the age of criminal responsibility by discussing four key issues. The four key issues selected by the consultative body are: an objective diagnosis of the actual state of juvenile delinquency; an analysis of the effectiveness of criminal punishment versus protective measures; an examination of the physical and mental maturity of juveniles and their capacity for criminal responsibility; and institutional improvement measures for preventing juvenile crime and recidivism.

I sincerely hope that discussions on this bill proceed smoothly, leading to a better life for the youth of the Republic of Korea. A habit without the possible threat of school-bullies.
